# Do You Qualify for a Mass Tort Case?

If you've been harmed due to a defective product, dangerous drug, or toxic exposure, you may be eligible to join a mass tort lawsuit. Below is a checklist of key eligibility criteria, a flowchart to help you determine if you should proceed with a claim, and important factors that may impact your case.

## Mass Tort Eligibility Checklist

Before filing a claim, you should meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Injury or Illness Documentation Medical records proving harm related to the product, drug, or exposure.
- ✓ Proof of Product Use or Exposure Receipts, prescriptions, medical implants, or witness testimony linking you to the harmful product.
- ✓ Consistent Symptoms & Diagnosis Medical history that aligns with known side effects or complications caused by the product.
- ✓ Legal Deadlines (Statute of Limitations) Lawsuits must be filed within a specific time frame, usually **2-4 years** from the date of injury or discovery.
- ✓ Similar Cases Filed Other individuals have reported similar injuries, forming the basis for a mass tort claim.

## Should You Proceed with a Mass Tort Claim?

Use this **flowchart** to determine if you should take legal action:

### [Flowchart Visual]

- Did you use a product, drug, or device that has been linked to injuries?
  - **⇒ Yes** → Go to Step 2
  - **No** → You may not qualify.
- 2 Have you experienced health complications or side effects related to this product?
  - **⇒** Yes → Go to Step 3
  - **No** → Mass tort cases require proof of harm.

- 3 Do you have medical records or documentation linking your injury to the product?
  - **⇒ Yes** → Go to Step 4
  - **No** → Evidence is crucial for legal success.

### 4 Has a lawsuit or recall been filed against the manufacturer?

- **→ Yes** → You may qualify for a claim. Contact a legal expert.
- **No** → You may still qualify. Consult an attorney for evaluation.

## **४**₺ Factors That Affect Case Eligibility

Several factors influence your ability to file a successful mass tort claim:

- **Severity of Injury** The stronger the medical evidence, the higher the likelihood of compensation.
  - Exposure Duration Prolonged use of a harmful drug or product strengthens your case.
- **Pre-existing Conditions** Some claims require proof that your injury was directly caused by the product, not a prior condition.
- State Laws & Deadlines Different states have varying statutes of limitations, so acting quickly is essential.
- Mass Tort Certification If your case is part of a recognized mass tort, it may proceed more efficiently.

#### What's Next?
