How to Obtain & Organize Your Medical Records

Step 1: Identify the Key Medical Records You Need

- ✓ Diagnosis Reports Confirm the medical condition caused by the harmful product.
- ✓ Hospital & Doctor Visit Records Include ER visits, surgeries, and specialist consultations.
- ✔ Prescription History Document all medications used, including those related to side effects.
- ✓ Treatment Plans & Progress Notes Show ongoing care, rehabilitation, and medication adjustments.
- ✓ Lab Tests & Imaging Reports X-rays, MRIs, blood tests proving health damage.

Tip: If your injuries developed over time, request **a full medical history** to track symptom progression.

Step 2: Request Your Medical Records

Under the **Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)**, you have the **legal right** to access your medical records. Follow these steps:

- ✓ Contact your doctor's office, hospital, or pharmacy.
- ✓ Submit a written request (See sample template below).
- ✓ Ask for digital copies for easier sharing with your attorney.
- ✓ Check for completeness Ensure all test results, doctor's notes, and treatments are included.
